JANUARY TRIP UPDATE

SPRING NEWSLETTER



Opened our new prenatal clinic

We inaugurated our prenatal clinic where our staff will provide regular check-ups, distribute prenatal vitamins and educate women about how to have a healthy pregnancy and safe delivery.

Provided health education to kids

Girls and women miss school or work every month due to lack of access to menstrual pads. Maureen Peroza and Darlene Duger led educational programs for school age children and nursing students.

We educated girls about menstruation and distributed 100 washable menstrual hygiene kits. We also conducted educational programs for children on germs and handwashing and distributed 250 personal hygiene kits (toothbrush, toothpaste, nail clippers, soap and stickers).



Our clinicians treated 750 patients

Over the course of 5 days, we provided primary medical care to 750 patients at multiple outpatient clinics and at the local Wesleyan Hospital. We treated acute conditions such as infections, and chronic conditions such as diabetes and high blood pressure. We also distributed free medications and vitamins.

Giving babies a fighting chance to survive

Dr. Tom Campfield and residents Drs. Jessica Penny and Angela Slick taught neonatal resuscitation training at a remote clinic and educated hospital staff on how to care for sick and premature infants. In addition, Dr. Andrew Healey provided an educational program on the induction of labor for hospital staff. We also distributed 20 birthing kits, 25 newborn kits and 12 resuscitation bags.



Trained women on use of water filtration

Roy Crystal and local trainers led the effort to create a collaboration with the non-profit, Water with Blessings, to distribute water filtration kits. We trained 30 women on how to use a filtration system to provide safe drinking water. Each woman will then provide clean water to her family and 4 other families, thus multiplying the benefit.
