Prenatal clinic

In July, we hired Dr. Nathalie Laguerre, a licensed Haitian physician. She has been providing prenatal care including routine screening and treatment for infections and high blood pressure. Her work is critical in helping reduce infant and maternal mortality.

On a very happy note, our congratulations to Nathalie on the birth to her first baby in October!

Clean water and economic empowerment of women!

We distributed 30 water filtration kits last January which remain in continued use, providing safe drinking water to families.

We plan to expand this project to train 60 new women during our next trip.

The water filtration project is run by local women and they have now started meeting regularly to discuss ways to support each other to start microbusinesses.

Menstrual Hygiene

Maureen joined the Agape board this fall and has been instrumental in the 'Days for Girls' program which educates girls about

menstruation and distributes washable menstrual hygiene kits.

This simple program helps girls stay in school when they are menstruating.

In 2018, we distributed 100 kits and in 2019 we will distribute 400 kits. In the next phase of this program, in addition to providing donated kits, we hope to train local women to sew and sell the kits local.

Fundraising Events

In March, we had successful annual fundraiser with Haitian food, silent auction and live music! The festive event brought together many of our donors and Agape team members.

We honored Dr. Daniel Mathews who generously donated \$10,000 to support the prenatal clinic. In addition, we raised \$8,250 from the event.

In September, we had a Bible study led by nationally recognized, Rabbi Ullman. It was enjoyable and stimulating evening of discussion which raised \$1,015.

Approximately 35 women generously contributed \$1,500 and United Parish of Brookline donated \$2,000 for our Days for Girls program.

The Agape Global Health for Haiti team members will be travelling on our annual trip to La Gonave, Haiti in January.

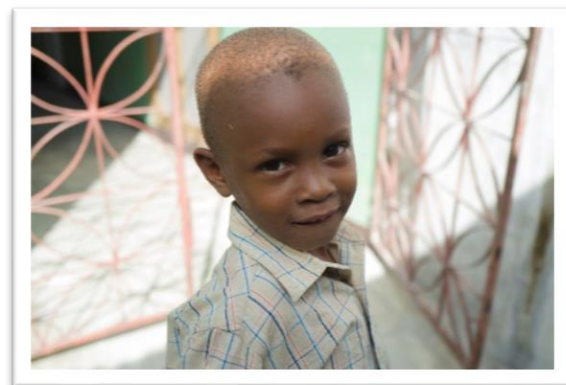
We plan to:
